We are pleased to share with you the highlights of Feeding Northeast Florida's accomplishments in 2022 and want to express our heartfelt gratitude for your support and dedication throughout the year. Together, we have made a profound impact on the lives of thousands of individuals and families in our community who have faced food insecurity.

In 2022, we thankfully turned the corner on the COVID-19 pandemic. Unfortunately, we also faced unprecedented challenges as the demand for food assistance increased significantly due to high inflation and the end of the enhanced emergency assistance programs enacted during the pandemic. The confluence of these factors resulted in a 20% + increase in the number of our neighbors seeking help over our COVID-19 highs. The food bank experienced similar challenges as our costs for labor, transportation, and food purchases increased significantly.

Despite the challenges, our dedicated team persevered. Through strategic partnerships, generous donors, and the tireless efforts of our volunteers, we distributed nearly 24 million meals to individuals and families who would have otherwise gone hungry. Your support and belief in our mission not only nourished bodies but also instilled hope and provided a sense of security to those facing difficult times.

As we look ahead, our focus is to optimize our distribution network and reduce gaps in access in our eight county service area. Our approach includes building out our infrastructure, improving technology and implementing innovative programs that address the root causes of food insecurity, ensuring that everyone has access to nutritious food and the opportunity to thrive.

Your investment in Feeding Northeast Florida has made the accomplishments of this challenging year possible. We hope that you will be inspired to continue your support as we work together to end hunger in Northeast Florida.

# Your Community Food Bank



## **Ensuring Food Safety**

Volunteers play a vital role in our mission. Each year, thousands of volunteers inspect donated food and grocery products for quality control. They then sort, label, box, and repackage the products for efficient distribution to our neighbors experiencing hunger.



# Supporting the People We Serve

The result is improved access to healthy and culturally preferred food that centers around the people we serve. Behind the scenes, we continually look for new and additional ways to improve access to food based on feedback from the people we serve and the support of donors who enable us to do what we do.

### Securing Food

Feeding Northeast Florida uses our fleet of 12 trucks to secure food donations from hundreds of grocery manufacturers, retailers, distributors, community food drives, farmers, government agencies, and other organizations. When not available through donations, we sometimes purchase items our neighbors need, such as culturally important or medically necessary foods.



# Distributing Food

Food and grocery items are distributed through our hunger relief network to people in need living in our eight county service area. The distribution includes food to food pantries, healthcare clinics, and meal programs that serve families, children, and individuals at risk of hunger. We also directly distribute food through pop-up markets and our three mobile Corner Market food pantries that include nutrition education.





# **New Studies**

- Over 18% of active duty military experience food insecurity, with Florida among the states with the highest frequency – MFAN, Military Family Support Programming Study.
- Households headed by single mothers face a 24% food insecurity rate — 8% higher than ones headed by single fathers — with food insecurity also increasing significantly for women living alone — USDA, Household Food Security in the U.S.
- Ending 2022, 19% of individuals identifying as LGBTQ+ in Florida were experiencing food insecurity – U.S. Census Bureau, Week 52 Household Pulse Survey.
- Of middle-income working adults in Florida making \$50,000-\$100,000, 36% faced food insecurity over the past year – No Kid Hungry Florida, Florida Hunger Survey.


 Adults with disabilities are three times more likely to live in families experiencing food insecurity than adults without disabilities (15% vs. 5%) – NCHS, Adults Living in Families Experiencing Food Insecurity.

- Florida ranks in the top 10 states for senior citizen food insecurity - Feeding America, The State of Senior Hunger.
- For the Feeding Northeast Florida service area, 20% of Black, 10% of Latino, and 7% of white individuals are experiencing food insecurity – Feeding America, Map the Meal Gap.



# Spotlight

- Announced plans for a new main facility which will allow warehouse capacity to nearly double from approximately 65,000 sq. ft. to 120,000 sq. ft.
- Implemented new technology to enhance outreach about SNAP benefits and streamline applications thereby augmenting accessibility, support, and dignity for an otherwise complicated process
- Facilitated agreement for community use of 11 plots of JEA land to create community farms
- Arranged for a community member with lived experience to present at the White House during its Conference on Hunger, Nutrition, and Health
- Awarded a state contract for \$950,000 to implement a public health and nutrition education program for SNAP-eligible populations




"We have had the opportunity to work with a family that has been homeless but are now settled in a small apartment but struggling to make ends meet. The children were so excited about the food, especially the fruit."
