### **A New Home For A Better Tomorrow**



Since our inception in 2014, Feeding Northeast Florida has worked tirelessly to rescue high-quality food and deliver it to those in need. We are currently facing immense challenges as our legacy facility limits our ability to procure, store, and distribute food to the over 260,000 foodinsecure neighbors in our service area.

We witness the impact of our work on individuals and families daily. To those who must choose between paying for food or medicine or skipping meals so their children can eat, our food pantries and programs extend beyond the dinner table. Our education, advocacy, and resources create a ripple effect of positive change throughout the community.

Our new warehouse will facilitate an even greater impact. Shedding space and system limitations will enable us to reach more people in need and further strengthen lives and communities.

The complex logistics of food distribution require coordination of refrigerated trucks, skilled staff, warehouses, cold storage facilities, and a network of food pantries. Feeding Northeast Florida excels in managing these complexities. However, our current facility prohibits us from achieving the scale we need.

Today, we serve more families struggling with hunger than ever before, but we can serve more. With your support, we can give families struggling with hunger a taste of hope and turn the despair of an empty stomach into the comfort of a home-cooked meal.

### **Meet Ivana**

Ivana's journey as a nurse at an affordable care clinic is deeply intertwined with her role as a mother. When she found out she was pregnant while in nursing school, Ivana faced a daunting challenge. "I was in survival mode. I didn't have access to any resources."


Ivana knew that providing healthy meals was vital for her and her daughter's health, so she found a local food pantry. "I was worried about my ability to pay for nursing school, keep my grades up, and provide for myself and my daughter." The assistance she received from the food pantries not only helped her graduate but also instilled in her a deep gratitude for the support she received when she needed it most.

Now, as a nurse, Ivana channels that gratitude into her work, particularly when connecting cancer patients with healthy food. "I sometimes have patients who have never needed help before but are now facing a cancer diagnosis, so they can't work. The burden of paying for food and the cancer treatment they need is written all over their faces." She understands the impact of providing more than just medical care; it's about offering hope and support, just as she received during her own time of need.

"People are so thankful when you give them food," she notes. "Their eyes well up, and they hug you. You can just see how much it means to them. It's obvious... food is love."

## We Need Your Help.


Operating in our original leased space from 2014, we now find ourselves severely constrained by space and system limitations. We can no longer adequately handle the increase in healthy, perishable foods that require refrigeration and prompt distribution. A myriad of process and storage hurdles cause daily delays and setbacks that affect our ability to get fresh food into the hands of the people who need it.

Luckily, these are entirely solvable limitations.

## The Future Is Bright.

With your help, we will transform how we function. This new facility is a game-changer, expanding our square footage from 60,000 to over 110,000 sqft. This expansion brings increased efficiency, lower costs, and enhanced capabilities to our operations.

Our consolidated location will unite staff, food, logistics, and operations under one roof, facilitating future growth and enabling us to serve more and do better.





### **Preserving History**

#### We want to be where we are most needed.

When choosing a site for our project, we prioritized staying in the 32254 area to serve the Northwest neighborhood, a significant food desert. Our research-led approach ensures we're increasing access to healthy food in the areas with the highest food insecurity rates. The location's proximity to major highways ensures efficient daily trips to our 12-county service area. Rather than constructing a new building, we've opted to renovate a 1950s window manufacturing facility, preserving its character and function while investing in the community we serve.

### **Building A Greener Future**

#### We are committed to sustainability.

We are actively working on ways to decrease both our carbon footprint and our energy bills, recognizing the importance of being good stewards of every dollar we receive. Our efforts include:

- Using solar energy to offset cooler and freezer energy use
- Upgrading to energy-efficient windows and doors
- Installing motion-sensor lights
- Improving the roof system to reduce energy consumption
- Installing commercial air purification systems to extend the life of fresh produce
- Creating a teaching garden with 12 raised beds, a greenhouse, and fruit trees for education and events

Our dedication to sustainability extends beyond our facility. Each year, our current initiatives prevent food waste in the community from retail partners, distributors, and in homes with the help of our nutrition education programs. Our efforts have led to the prevention of over 218 million pounds of food waste and the reduction of 828 million pounds of greenhouse gas emissions. These efforts are equivalent to removing over 81,646 cars from the road.
